## The Duke of York's flag

The Art Gallery & Museum will be showing a large Royal Standard as its contribution to SeaBritain 2005.

The silk flag, dating from 1799, is the standard of Frederick, Duke of York, one of George III's sons, and was flown from the frigate *Amethyst* when it took the Duke to Holland in September 1799. It was given to the Museum in 1931 by a descendant of John Cooke, the captain of the *Amethyst*.

The flag will be on display in the Museum meeting room on 20, 21 and 23 May.

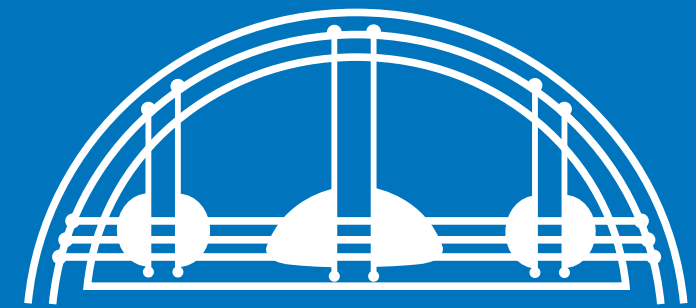

There is still time to see these stunning, painterly textiles based on *The Odyssey* by one of Britain's leading textile artists, Alice Kettle.

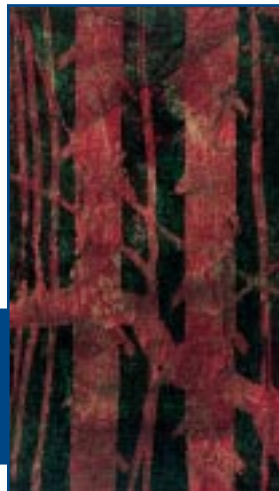
## The Forests of Vancouver Island - British Columbia
